Learn how to spell **archaeologist**, **Stone**, **Bronze** and **Iron Age**









Know that the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age are part of **prehistory**, and that prehistory is the time in history **before** people had developed a written language.

Know that the Stone Age **came a long, long, long time** after the dinosaurs had died out.



Know that an **archaeologist** is someone who learns about the past by examining **the remains** of buildings, pottery, skeletons and other objects.

	Stone Age	Bronze Age	Iron Age
How long ago.	<p>The Stone Age lasted a very long time.</p> <p>Stone Age people lived in Britain about 800,000 years ago until about 4,500 years ago when it became the Bronze Age. About 800,000 BC- 2500 BC</p>	<p>The Stone Age turned into the Bronze Age and lasted until about 2,800 years ago when it became the Iron Age.</p> <p>About 2500 – 800 BC</p>	<p>The Iron Age began about 2,800 years ago and lasted for about 850 years when the Romans invaded Britain.</p> <p>About 800 BC – AD 43</p>
Tools and weapons	<p>Made from a type of stone called flint.</p> 	<p>Made from a metal called bronze.</p> 	<p>Made from a metal called iron.</p> 
Homes	<p>Caves and then later, tents made from animal skin.</p> 	<p>Round houses with a fire in the middle for warmth,</p> 	<p>Similar to homes in the Bronze Age.</p> 
Clothes	<p>Clothes were made from the skin of animals that had been hunted.</p> 	<p>People learnt how to weave sheep's wool to make simple clothes.</p> 	<p>Iron Age people also wove sheep's wool to make their clothes. They dyed the wool first.</p>
