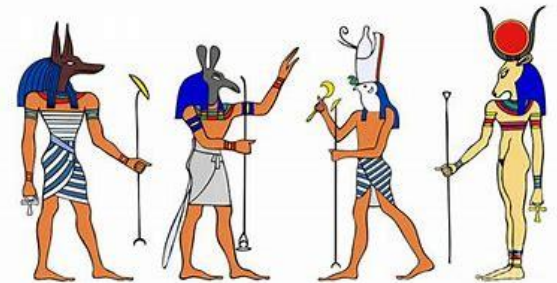

ANCIENT EGYPTIANS



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Your child will be learning:

Ancient Egypt as we know it began about 5000 years ago beside the River Nile in Northern Africa. This term your child will be travelling back to this point in time.

Ancient Egypt history spans thirty centuries and throughout this time the country was ruled by kings called pharaohs. In English, we will be investigating the discovery of a famous pharaoh called Tutankhamen. We shall report our findings by writing and presenting a newsflash.

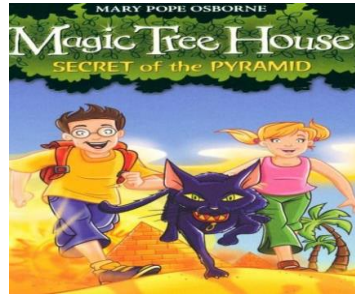
Ancient Egyptians believed in an afterlife and thought that by saying the name of the dead person, you could make them live forever. Another way to achieve immortality was to use mummification; a process that we shall delve further into. In History we shall be comparing and contrasting the lives of ancient Egyptian children with children today. How different will they be?

As part of Science we shall be looking in detail at plants and the requirements needed to make them grow and keep them healthy.

A trip at the end of the term to the New Walk Museum will help us to consolidate the knowledge we have acquired throughout this teaching unit and bring alive all the things we have discussed and imagined. Join us in our wondrous journey and let your child lead the way.
