Here are two photos from the History Suffragette Workshop with Peter Barratt, the great grandson of Alice Hawkins of Leicester. Her statue can be found in the Market Square in Leicester City Centre.



Year 6 experienced a first hand account of historical events regarding a real suffragette named Alice Hawkins, who was born in 1863 and died in 1928, she actively campaigned for women's right to vote between 1907-1920 in Leicester. Alice's great grandson shared real stories about his great grandmother that were shared by his late grandfather when Peter was a young boy. Peter inherited all of Alice's memorabilia through his family, which he shared through photographs and the website www.alicehawkinssuffragette.co.uk. The children listened with fascination and interest. They asked some brilliant questions to deepen their knowledge of the suffragette movement and then they wrote a diary entry from a female perspective in English. The children carefully captured how the suffragettes were treated during the marches and when they were sentenced to 14 days in Holloway Prison in London.

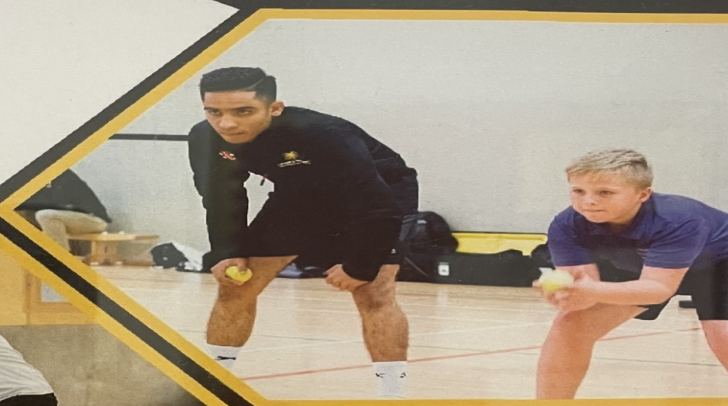

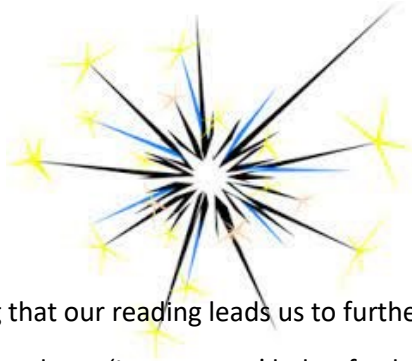

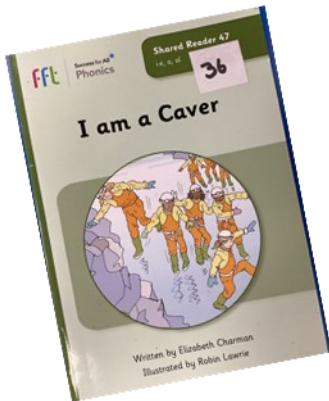


Reading sparks our interest!

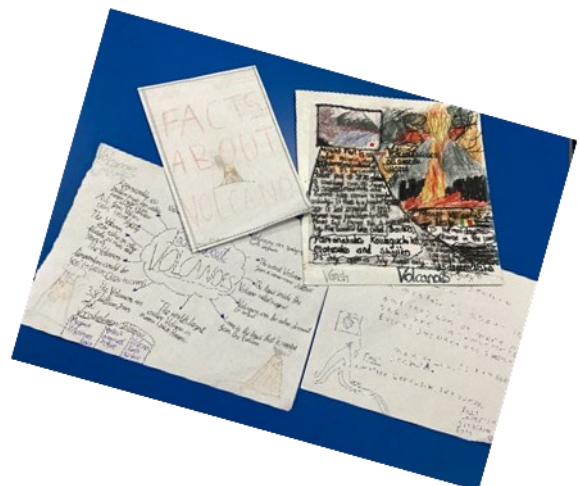
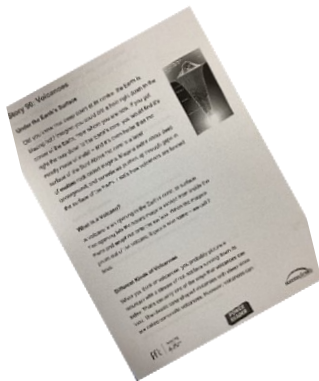


We are realising that our reading leads us to further reading and research.
